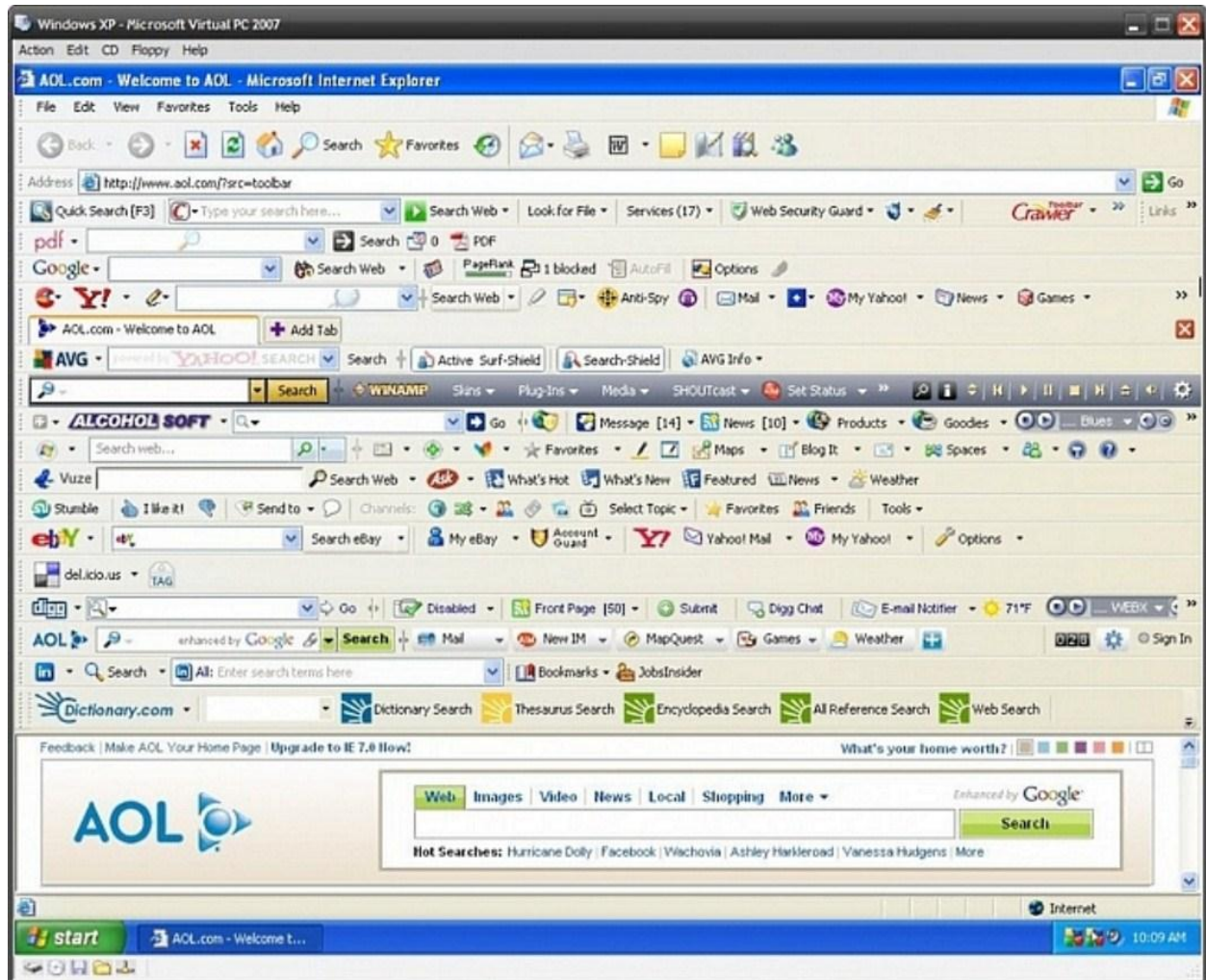


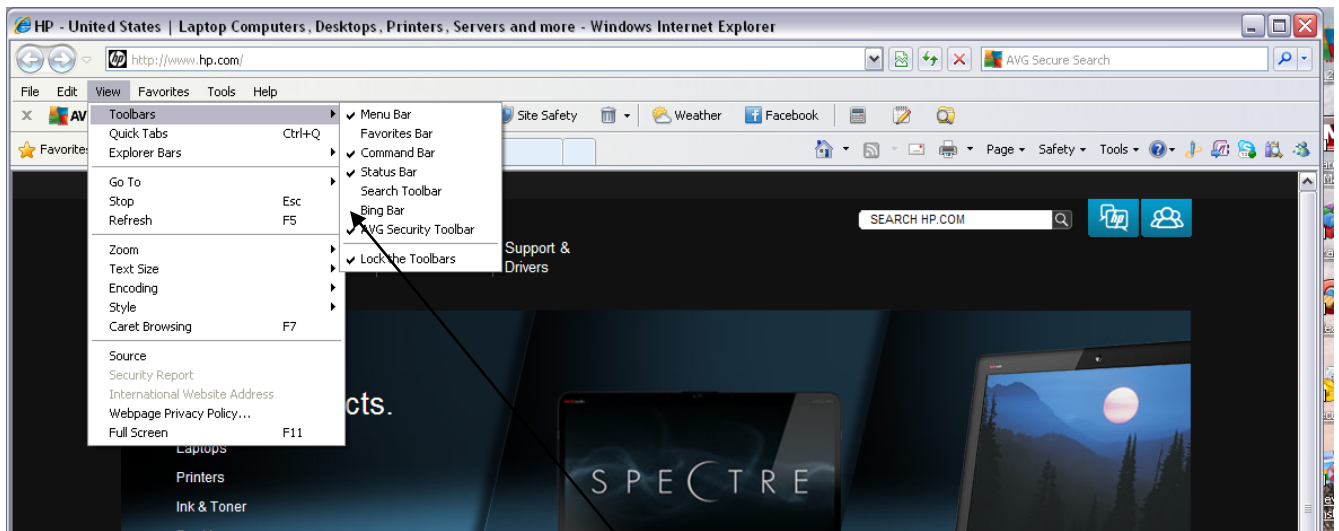
Well, Sir or Lady Clicks-a-lot—What Now?

It happened slowly. As you visited web sites and downloaded things. Some of them want you to install a toolbar or search bar. And you just clicked yes. Now does your Internet Explorer look something like this?



Now that you can't get anywhere... or can't see the whole page what are you going to do?

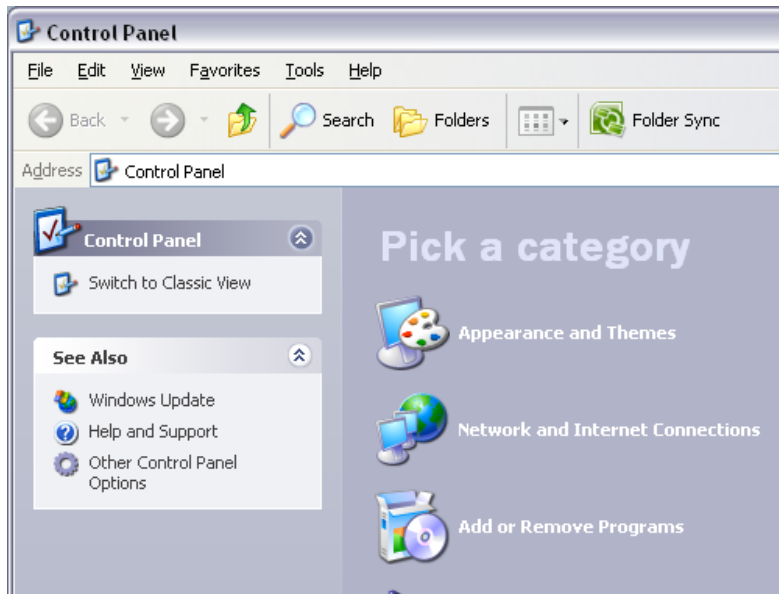
Well... first you have to hide them. You do it like this:



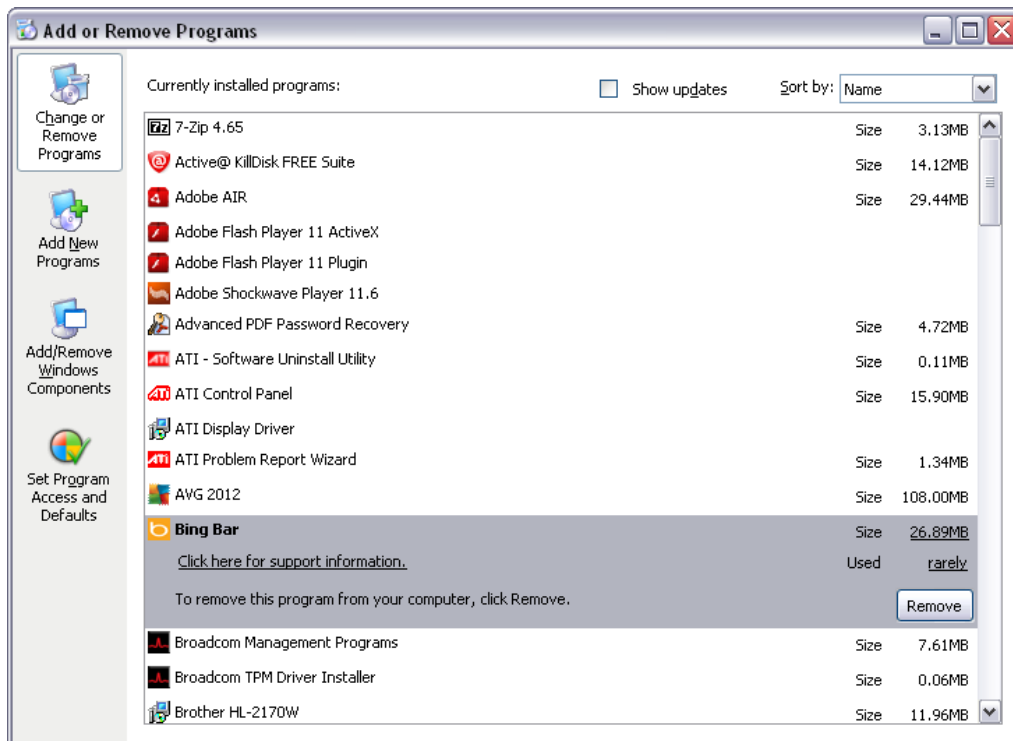
You can actually type in an address (Universal Resource Locator [URL]) or click your favorite and see the webpage. While they're not clogging everything up anymore, they're still installed and there, slowing your computer down and some of them are watching where you're going and keeping careful track of you! So, you've got to take them out and blow up the records they leave too.

This can happen one of two ways:

1. You can remove with the “Add or Remove Programs” in the Control Panel.



Click Add or Remove Programs, and you'll see



after it populates you'll see something like this... I've selected the Bing Bar. Now just click the "Remove button. It will chug around for a while and take *some* of it out. Now, if you want it all the way out. You have to have something that can "Search and Destroy."

2. Or, if you want it gone—all gone—leaving nothing behind you can download Revo Uninstaller at: http://www.revouninstaller.com/revo_uninstaller_free_download.html

You want the freeware one (version 1.53) the download button is right below the version number. Just let it run rather than save it.

Once it installs and opens you'll see this:



I clicked on the Bing Bar again and click uninstall.

When it starts chugging around you'll see a progress bar. It will start the automatic uninstall.

You answer yes to remove. Then it will get to the file folders and registry keys.... You want them all out!
